Registration

Registration is now open on a first-come, first-served basis. The size of each program is limited in order to provide a quality experience for all children. Please enroll early to be assured of a spot for your children. **A \$100 non-refundable deposit per child, per session, must be submitted with the Registration Contract** and will be applied to the cost of the program. The balance must be paid in full by June 1, 2012. After June 1, full payment is required with each Registration Contract. **No Refunds are given for absenteeism due to change in family plans, vacations, or similar reasons.**

Parent/Child Sunset Sails

Your entire family can experience the sail training offered in our marine programs through sunset sails aboard The Stony Brook School's 25-30-foot cruising sailboats. These 3-hour sunset sail excursions start at 6 pm and are available on two Friday evenings (July 6 and August 3) and two Saturday evenings (July 7 and August 4). Capt. George Linzee and other SBS captains will each take charge of a school keelboat that can take up to six persons each. Drawing upon vast backgrounds, the captains will share stories and interesting facts about the sea as they instruct the crew (your family) on safely sailing out in Long Island Sound. The cost is \$35 per adult and \$20 per child ages 12 or under. The trips begin and end at the Public launch located just west of the Port Jefferson ferry terminal. SBS Sports Camps utilize The Stony Brook School's outstanding athletic facilities, including 6 tennis courts, 4 soccer fields, the Robert S. Swanson Gymnasium, Kinney Field House, and Buyers' Park. Each child will receive a camp shirt and a ball or cap, depending on the sport. Awards will be given at the end of each camp.

Mini Sports

Mini-Sports, which is a part of the Stony Brook School Sports Camps (pages 4-7), will give campers the opportunity to try a variety of sports – track and field, tee ball, basketball, flag football, soccer, tennis, and more – with an emphasis on fun! Sessions will be taught by varsity-level coaches from the Stony Brook School's high school programs. Our goal is to provide a foundation in a variety of sports for campers to build upon as they mature. Beyond sport-specific activities,

campers will also participate in agility drills that will help lay the groundwork for life-long fitness. We will also be hosting guest speakers from local organizations, like our own Long Island Ducks. A morning and afternoon snack will be provided. Golf

The golf camp introduces the game of golf to beginning players and allows more experienced players to improve their skills. Soccer

Co-ed, Grades 4-10

The soccer camp at Stony Brook School is a fantastic experience for all players, whether you have been playing with teams for years or are just learning the game. Stony Brook is proud to be home to the 2009 New York State High School Athletic Association Champions in soccer! Your child will be coached by players and coaches from that State Championship team, as well as coaches with over 25 years coaching experience! Players will learn passing, dribbling, and shooting techniques. They will be introduced to strategies on breaking down defenders and containing offensive

players. They will be taught according to the “Four Pillars of the Game” (Technical, Tactical, Psychological, and Physical). Afternoon games will give players a chance to use new skills as they are put into action with teammates. The camp concludes with an all-camp tournament to crown a camp champion, which families are invited to attend. The two-week session will give players a chance to build deeper relationships and coaches a chance to make a more lasting impact on the players. Marine Programs offer exciting on-the-water experiences for students who want to learn marine and environmental science, sailing and regatta competition, coastal environment stewardship, and/or gain leadership experience and sea time that can lead to a USCG captain's license and instructor certification when they turn 17. Over the years, 15 participants have earned their licenses through our "Captains in Training" program and now are instructors. Regatta Sailors

The Regatta Sailors program is ideal for middle or high school students, both experienced and inexperienced, who want to learn how to sail and race in high performance sailing dinghies. This program utilizes 12 two-man Vanguard 420s and 2 one-man Vanguard Lasers to immerse participants in large fleet and team racing regatta competitions. Grouping sailors into sections based on age and sailing experience, this program will help sailors of all skill levels, both beginning and advanced, to progress through crewing and skippering roles and prepare for interscholastic sailing competition. Training includes shore instruction, off and on water drills, video evaluation of development, racing rules, and regatta competition. \$770

Island Cruisers

Learn the joys of life aboard a sailboat as you cruise the waters of Long Island Sound. Two to three 30-foot Alberg auxiliary sloops and a 34-foot Tartan are used to immerse participants in a full two-week voyaging program

that includes basic and intermediate training in sailing, racing, seamanship, navigation, as well as environmental awareness. In addition to training, the schedule includes several day-sail excursions and a two-day overnight cruise to an exciting Long Island Sound destination that could be a historic maritime center or secluded shore with unspoiled scenery. Island Cruisers are assigned to a particular keelboat by age, gender, and experience. Invite a friend to join the program and they will be placed on the same crew. For sailors over 14, sea-time counts towards a USCG captain's license. \$850





Beachcombers

Session A: July 2 – July 13

Co-ed, Grades 4-6

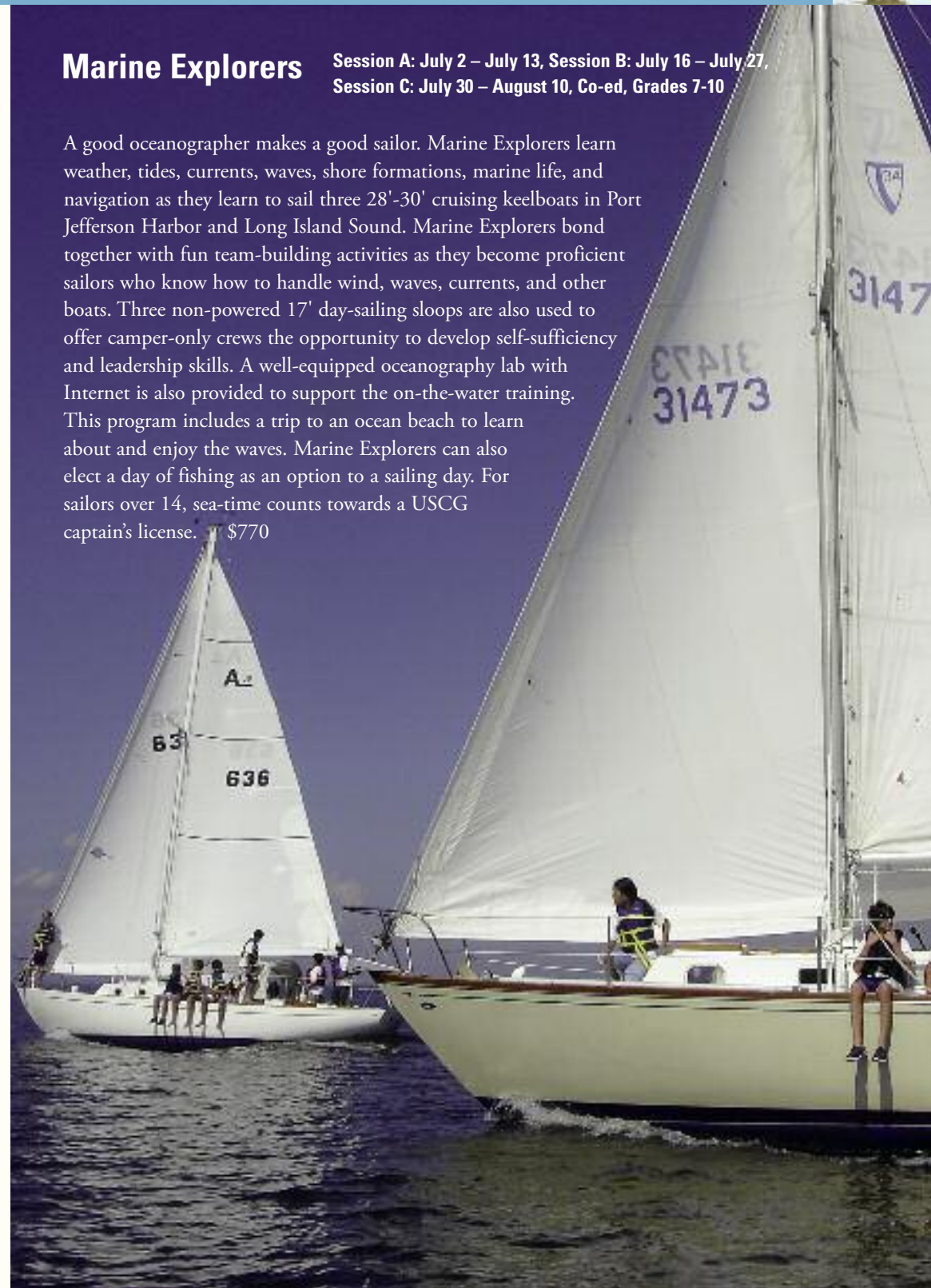
Beachcombers have fun observing and collecting Long Island marine life while they learn to sail a cruising keelboat. Starting out each day in an internet-connected marine lab, campers learn about life in the sea and how to set up and care for saltwater aquaria. Beachcombers then launch out into Port Jefferson Harbor on three 25'- 27' cruising keelboats to learn sailing and navigation while exploring for marine life in various ecosystems. Daily activities can include beach hikes, collecting with nets, swimming, tubing, and a stewardship project. Children can also chose fishing and/or canoeing as an option. Each session features at least one day exploring an ocean beach and another visiting the Atlantis Aquarium in Riverhead. \$770



Marine Explorers

Session A: July 2 – July 13, Session B: July 16 – July 27,
Session C: July 30 – August 10, Co-ed, Grades 7-10

A good oceanographer makes a good sailor. Marine Explorers learn weather, tides, currents, waves, shore formations, marine life, and navigation as they learn to sail three 28'-30' cruising keelboats in Port Jefferson Harbor and Long Island Sound. Marine Explorers bond together with fun team-building activities as they become proficient sailors who know how to handle wind, waves, currents, and other boats. Three non-powered 17' day-sailing sloops are also used to offer camper-only crews the opportunity to develop self-sufficiency and leadership skills. A well-equipped oceanography lab with Internet is also provided to support the on-the-water training. This program includes a trip to an ocean beach to learn about and enjoy the waves. Marine Explorers can also elect a day of fishing as an option to a sailing day. For sailors over 14, sea-time counts towards a USCG captain's license. \$770





Explorers

Session A: July 2 – July 13

The Explorers program is a must for active campers who love the outdoors! Each day campers set out for an exciting adventure on Long Island. Typical explorations include hiking through Long Island's state and county parks, biking on

the Rocky Point or Glacier Ridge trails, canoeing the Nissolequogue, swimming at different beaches, and indoor rock climbing. Explorers need to bring a suitable

mountain bike and helmet on biking days. A schedule of trips is provided at the start of each session. Children must bring their own lunch, backpack and water everyday. \$700



Adventure Explorers

A more rigorous version of the Explorers Program for the older or more advanced campers, the Adventurer group will embark on a 3-day, 2-night camping trip in the tri-state area. The camp is limited to 12 participants, so register early!

Each Adventure Explorer's skills and abilities will be evaluated the first two days of the camp to ensure that he or she can maintain the more rigorous level of Adventure Explorers. Due to the off-campus nature of the program, children must bring their own lunches, backpack and water everyday. Past camping trips have included: hiking the Lemon Squeeze at Mount Mohonk in the Shawangunk Mountains, camping in Worthington State Forest in New Jersey and kayaking the Delaware Water Gap, and most recently a 30-mile canoe trip down the Delaware Water Gap where we camped alongside the river. \$800

Nature Quest

Co-ed, Grades 5-10

Nature Quest is a program for those who want to learn about and care for our environment by participating in fun and interesting activities. Some of these may include field trips to go hiking and canoeing, exploring local ecosystems, observing live animals, restoring native habitats, as well as hands-on nature and wood working projects. After exploring different ecosystems in the region and on

the school's 55-acre campus, participants can investigate their discoveries in the environmental science lab. They will also learn practical ways to conserve energy and resources to discover and understand we can all make a difference in the world. Swim breaks and other water activities provide an ideal balance between fun, learning and service. \$750



Future Engineers of America

Session A: July 2 – July 13
Session B: July 16 – July 27
Co-ed, Grades 3-6

Future Engineers of America (FEA) is an exciting, hands-on science program filled with adventure, exploration, and skill development. Utilizing The Stony Brook School's science and computer labs, along with trips to Long Island science education sites, FEA engages young learners in a range of fun activities that instill a desire to explore sci-

ence and technology as a creative part of their lives. Included are aviation and rocketry projects, physical science experiments, engineering challenge-contests, and initial computer training such as web research. The weekly schedule rotates each day so participants experience a range of other activities that include outdoor games, life-value discussions, and an exciting field trip in addition to their science activities. \$750



Advanced FEA

Session A: July 2 – July 13, Session B: July 16 – July 27
Co-ed, Grades 6-10

Advanced FEA builds on the science foundation that FEA established and takes enrollees to higher levels of technological development. More advanced building and programming of robots as well as leading-edge advances in science and medicine will be explored. The program also introduces the study of alternative energies – solar, wind and water – and the fundamental scientific concepts behind these technologies. Computer skills with media technologies will be

introduced to and used by the students for presentations. Participants will also travel to field trip sites that relate to the projects that they are working on. Sensitive to student interest and past experience, instructors will guide the design of advanced projects to maximize student input and creativity. Balancing the day are stewardship and worldview discussions and active team-building challenges that develop leadership skills and instill a positive group spirit. \$775



Junior Brookers



**Session A: July 2 – July 13, Session B:

Junior Brookers is a co-ed introductory program that combines physical, social, and academic growth to prepare young people for elementary and middle school. Under the guidance of mature,

experienced instructors, participants are involved in fun, educational activities that encourage positive life values and healthy new creative endeavors to explore. Age appropriate activities include interaction with live marine and land animals, fun science and technology projects, introductions to sailing, canoeing and fishing along with other sports and games. Swim breaks and other water

activities round out the program.

The group will go on at least one field trip each week. Past field trips have included Holtsville Ecology Center, Port Jefferson Harbor, West Meadow Beach and The Stony Brook Veterans' Home. Junior Brookers is the ideal introduction to all of the specialty summer programs. A morning and afternoon snack will be provided. \$700





Elementary Tutorial

Session A: July 2 – July 13
Session B: July 16 – July 27
Session C: July 30 – August 10
Co-ed, Grades 1-6

The Elementary Tutorial Program supervised by Karen Dyrli is designed to meet the specialized academic needs of the children in our Summer Programs. Parents can select for their child to receive each day small group (2-3 per tutor) instruction 1 hour before the program day starts and/or 1-2 hours at the end of the day. Tutorial is individually tailored to each child's needs based on both the tutor's assessment and parental input. Specializing in the review, reinforcement, and development of reading, math, and writing skills, tutorial can also benefit ELA and NYS testing results. All materials are provided but the student may bring in a particular textbook if assistance with it is desired. Weekly updates will be provided to parents. Two week session rates are \$250 for 10 one-hour per day tutorials, \$450 for 10 two-hours per day tutorials, and \$600 for 10 three-hour per day tutorials.

SAT Prep Course

Session A: July 2 – July 15,
Session B: July 15 – July 29

Stony Brook School faculty member, Mr. Michael Hickey, teaches this highly successful SAT prep course. In past sessions, average improvement has been almost 250 points with some students improving 400 points. Content includes test-taking strategies, skill development, timed drills, and individual feedback. Offered twice, the courses begin with an initial SAT test on Sunday afternoon from 2-6 pm. The instruction is given during evening classes Monday through Thursday, from 6:30-9:30, for the following two weeks. The courses then conclude with a final SAT test on the following Sunday 2-6 pm. The course fee covers all instructional material. \$825

SBS Summer Support Programs are an extension of The Stony Brook School's Academic Support & Enrichment Program, a yearlong service providing academic help and organizational training to SBS students. While the summer programs provide opportunities for these students to continue their academic skills development, non-SBS students can participate on a limited basis in the programs with open enrollment. Offerings include enhancement in computational and basic algebra, learning strategies and study skills, organization, reading comprehension, writing, and content mastery. Piano Festival

July 1 – July 14

The Stony Brook International Piano Festival honoring Jorge Bolet is a two week immersion program for middle and high-school students who are serious about piano study. Students receive two or three private lessons each week from faculty members, along with supervised daily practice, and master classes taught by guest artists. Performance opportunities include a recital at Carson Auditorium, an outreach concert, and a final concert at New York City's Steinway



Hall. Other enrichment opportunities include concerts and lectures by guest performers and mini-courses on related subjects such as music theory, piano literature, and practice methods. These exciting two weeks will also include cultural excursions to New York City, and outings to nearby Port Jefferson Harbor and historic Stony Brook Village. Tuition includes lodging, all meals, transportation to and from the airport, private lessons, concert admission fees, and two trips to New York City. \$2500

Sound Learning

July 15 – July 28, Co-ed,
Entering Grades 6-10

Sound Learning is designed to provide an introduction for those students interested in exploring boarding life at The Stony Brook School.

The program features a highly supportive atmosphere where experienced Middle School teachers share their enthusiasm for life and love of learning. From July 15-28, a select group of Middle School students will immerse themselves in a fun and challenging residential academic program designed to foster future success in college and in life.

Each day will start with a core course focused on developing writing skills. The courses will combine expository with creative writing, and will train students in the type of writing needed for success in high school and beyond, as well as for the new SAT. Each day the students will receive feedback from experienced writing instructors, while utilizing our modern



computer lab for a writing workshop. Following the writing course, students will experience learning in a hands-on fashion. Students will be able to choose an elective course from a list of exciting options. The elective options are Marine Science, Robotics, Theater Arts, and Visual Arts. Each weekday evening, Sound Learning students participate in a sailing program that focuses on team-building. Students learn together as they cruise and race on our fleet of sailboats that range from 14 to 30 feet. The program also features a full day in New York City complete with Broadway Show tickets and a visit to a museum, as well as a weekly ocean trip. Space in this program is very limited and admission is by application only; please contact the camp office for details. \$2995





Registration Contract

A \$100 non-refundable deposit per child, per session, must be submitted with the Registration Contract in order to reserve a spot for each child and will be applied to the cost. The balance must be paid in full by June 1st, 2012. After June 1st, full payment is required with each Registration Contract. There is a \$10 change fee for switching programs. The Registration Contract is binding and by signing it the patron is responsible for full payment of all fees, even if the child(ren) stop attending, except in cases of illness or injury. No refunds are given for absenteeism due to change in family plans, vacation, or similar reasons.

Refund Policy

No refunds after June 1st, 2012. In cases of sickness or injury, fees will be prorated with a required doctor's note. We reserve the right to dismiss a child without refund if conduct is detrimental to his well being or the well being of any other child or staff. The parent accepts these terms by signing the Registration Contract.

Medical Forms

We are required by county law to have a medical form, with immunization record, which must be completed by both a parent and a doctor, on file before the child begins camp. The medical form is included in the brochure and on line at www.stonybrookschoool.org. Failure to submit a completed medical form to the camp will result in a refusal to allow the child to attend camp. In an attempt to regulate this issue, we will not allow children to be dropped off at carline if we do not have the medical form in hand. Only medical exams after July 1, 2011 will be accepted.

Lost or Stolen Property

Please mark all clothing with nametags. If your child loses something please call the Summer Programs office (631)751-1800 ext. #595 and plan to retrieve the item promptly. Items will be donated to charity after the last session. We assume no responsibility for lost or stolen property and discourage children from bringing anything of value, such as jewelry, money, or expensive clothing, to camp.

Accident Insurance

Each child is covered by accident insurance. This limited benefit coverage is secondary to parent's primary medical insurance. After a \$25 deductible, the policy will pay for medical bills incurred while your child is at camp, provided any and all other parent's medical insurance has been exhausted.

Drop-off and Pick-up Procedures

For the safety of all children, a counselor will escort your child to and from your vehicle as you drop-off or pick-up on Chapman Parkway. If you need to stay for any time, please park in the lot behind Johnston Hall, which is accessible from Cedar Street. **If you drop off a child early (before 8:00) or pick a child up late (after 4:00), the child will be put in the Extended Day Program and you will be required to pay the fees incurred.**

Extended Day

The Extended Day Program is designed with the working family in mind. If a parent needs to bring a child to Summer Programs early Extended Day is available from 7 am to 8 am. Likewise, if a child needs to be picked up after the program is over Extended Day is available from 4 pm to 6 pm. There is a \$7 an hour or \$100 per session charge for this service. Please only pre-pay if you intend on using 15 hours or more of this service.

Prohibited Items

CD players, iPods and electronic games are not permitted. Cell phones may not be used during camp, and shoes with wheels may not be worn. The use of tobacco, alcohol, and drugs by children and staff is strictly prohibited on The Stony Brook School campus.
